


#### Head of Year 9 - Mr Simon Barr Smith



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



#### **Institute of Economics Affairs Essay Prize**

Congratulations go to Gauri, Year 12 Economics student who was placed runner up in the IEA essay competition with her answer to the following essay title:

'To what extent are central banks to blame for the current inflation episode?'

Here is her account of her amazing achievement.

Over the Christmas holidays, I submitted an essay for the Institute of Economic Affairs (IEA) Monetary Policy Essay Prize about the extent of central banks' culpability for the current inflation episode. I was excited to be invited to London for the final of the competition in March, which involved delivering a ten-minute presentation on my essay before a panel of judges, followed by questions and answers surrounding my approach. From sixth-form students to university undergraduates, It was fantastic to be up against people who shared my enthusiasm for researching monetary policy. The judging panel, which included the IEA's Head of Education and the directors of the Institute of International Monetary Research, acknowledged the varying levels of expertise among us and challenged us with questions based on the arguments we put forth in our presentations. Ultimately, I was awarded joint runner-up with a student from the London School of Economics, a prize of £250 and a place on the IEA's summer programme for sixth-formers. The experience was a great opportunity for me to research an area of interest in macroeconomics and develop my writing and speaking skills. Most of all, I had the opportunity to learn from other contestants' perspectives and research on the topic, and I left the day eager to read more about monetary policy in my economics lessons and beyond.

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#### **News from the Development Office**


On Sunday 18th June 2023 we will be celebrating 150 Years of Cricket at Nottingham High School. This historic occasion will be held at Valley Road.




#### **News from the Development Office**



# Careers Update - May 2023

#### HighFliers recently quoted twice as many graduates as graduate jobs available, for the class of 2020.

The full recording and latest insights are online until the end of May (click the logo to view), but it is clear that those who have done their research and actively sought opportunities for work experience and internships stand a significantly better chance of securing the available positions. In addition, if the average graduate role receives 39 applications, then those with the resilience to keep applying and improving their applications on successive tries will be best placed to secure opportunities. Students can't assume they will be successful first time

Many graduate roles and also degree apprenticeships require applicants to undertake multiple rounds of psychometric testing, online interviews and group assessments, so the more practice students have in these areas, the better prepared they will be. We are encouraging our Year 12s to try out online interviews and parents are also welcome to try them
