Mobile Phones in School

The vast majority of IJS pupils have no need to bring a mobile phone/smart phone to school. For those pupils in Years 3 to 6 who travel home on a school bus and/or on public transport and/or walking home with an older sibling, a parent may feel that having a mobile phone/smart phone might be appropriate. In these circumstances, provided the rules set out below are adhered to, we would allow a phone to be in school.

If your child travels to school independently and you would like them to have a phone, please complete the form via this link to keep us informed. It is very important that all children who bring such a device to school understand the School's rules about mobile phone use. These important rules are in place to protect all of our pupils and so please discuss them with your child at home.

Policies within school that would relate to mobile phones would include:

IT Acceptable Use Policy

Online Safety Policy

In addition to these, NHIJS Rules regarding mobile phones:

- * Pupils and parents must acknowledge that there is a risk of phones being lost, damaged or used inappropriately in school.
 - * The school accepts no responsibility for loss or damage to mobile phones. Please avoid sending valuable phones to school.
- * Mobile phones should remain switched off in the child's bag, for the duration of the school day (including on the playground or in the dining hall before and after school, and in the cloakrooms).
- * Parents should not contact their child via their mobile during the school day. (Parents can always get a message to their child by calling the school office.)
 - * Pupils' phones should be clearly marked with their name.
- * If a pupil is found to be using a phone on school premises, this is a serious matter and will be dealt with in accordance with the School's Promoting Good Behaviour Policy, The IT Acceptable Use policy and the Online Safety Policy. It is likely that the phone would be confiscated and parents contacted.

Whether at home or at school, please remember that mobile phones provide easy access to the internet which is full of fantastic opportunities but can also be a very risky place. It is important that we all work together to keep children safe. We strongly recommend that you enable parental controls on your child's phone, and talk to your child about how to stay safe online. GOOSE FAIR Friday 29th September – Sunday 8th October 2023

As in previous years, Nottingham City Council is intended to implement 'no stopping' zones and traffic restrictions in the streets surrounding the Goose Fair site. These restrictions apply to all vehicles and are to prevent unwanted parking in the area and to maintain access routes for residents and emergency vehicles.

As part of these restrictions, it is proposed to make Forest Road East one way eastbound and implement a no stopping zone along its whole length. Traffic will also be prevented from accessing Forest Road from Mansfield Road and the adjacent side streets i.e.

North Sherwood Street

Colville Street

Addison Street

Balmoral Road

Traffic will however be permitted, within the one way system, to turn right from Forest Road East to enter Addison Street.

It is also proposed to make Arboretum Street one way westbound and waiting restrictions will also be introduced on Arboretum Street, Addison Street and Balmoral Avenue.

It is anticipated that these restrictions will enable easier access for school buses and we would be grateful if you could inform the bus operators to approach from the west along Forest Road and enter via Addison Street.

The restrictions will be identified with 'no stopping signs' and enforced throughout the Goose Fair period.

We are aware that it is usual practice for many parents to arrive prior to the end of the school day and wait on Forest Road. In view of the no stopping restrictions and to accommodate such vehicles, the Council are offering the facility to park free of charge within the Goose Fair site for this short period. Vehicles should enter via the Blue Badge Parking entrance (Gate 12) opposite Balmoral Road and then immediately turn left and park along the top path way. This service will be available from 15.30 to 16.30.

A map identifying the location and access and egress points within the Goose Fair site and details of the no stopping areas and the traffic management arrangements for your information is **attached**.

Infant School Uniform Update
