GOOSE FAIR Friday 29th September – Sunday 8th October 2023

As in previous years, Nottingham City Council has implemented 'no stopping' zones and traffic restrictions in the streets surrounding the Goose Fair site. These restrictions apply to all vehicles and are to prevent unwanted parking in the area and to maintain access routes for residents and emergency vehicles.

As part of these restrictions, Forest Road East will be one way eastbound and implement a no stopping zone along its whole length. Traffic will also be prevented from accessing Forest Road from Mansfield Road and the adjacent side streets i.e.

North Sherwood Street

Colville Street

Addison Street

Balmoral Road

Traffic will however be permitted, within the one way system, to turn right from Forest Road East to enter Addison Street.

Arboretum Street will also be one way westbound and there will be waiting restrictions on Arboretum Street, Addison Street and Balmoral Avenue.

The restrictions will be identified with 'no stopping signs' and enforced throughout the Goose Fair period.

We are aware that it is usual practice for many parents to arrive prior to the end of the school day and wait on Forest Road. In view of the no stopping restrictions and to accommodate such vehicles, the Council are offering the facility to park free of charge within the Goose Fair site for this short period. Vehicles should enter via the Blue Badge Parking entrance (Gate 12) opposite Balmoral Road and then immediately turn left and park along the top path way. This service will be available from 15.30 to 16.30. There will also still be the facility to drop off and collect your child from the main school yard from 4.15pm until 6pm, please ensure you leave enough time for any traffic delays you may encounter.

There is a possibility of tram strikes over the Goose Fair period. We do have a school bus service where you can book ad hoc journeys if required, please use the following link to find out further information;
