



**Suren T. (6C)** for producing a really insightful piece of work about self-respect. His reflections displayed a high level of maturity.


**Kareem H. (6C)** for his work on self-respect which was really powerful, showing a real sense of positivity.

**Teddy C. (3G)** for taking such good care of a visiting child during a Taster Day that the child's mummy sent a glowing email full of praise for Teddy's kindness.










#### INFANT AND JUNIOR SCHOOL OTHER ACHIEVEMENTS TO CELEBRATE
