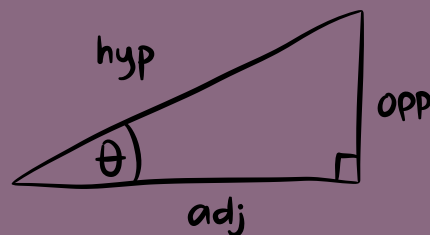

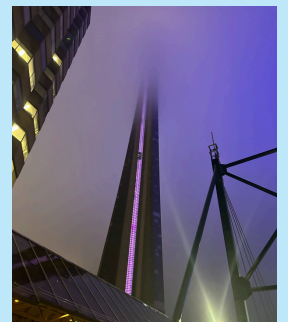

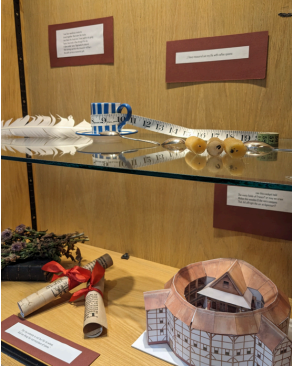

Curiosity Cabinet

This month, the curiosity cabinet features twenty objects chosen by the English Department. All of them feature prominently in works of literature – as ways of working, as a source of inspiration, or as a pure invention. Ranging from goose-quills to frankfurters, and from diamond rings to a modified drain plunger, the objects cross continents and span over a thousand years of writing. They represent Anglo-Saxon riddles, Jacobean drama, contemporary Nigerian fiction, and plenty in between! There are lots of details to catch the eye and invite questions: what does the conch represent? Why is there a green light? Who measured out their life with coffee spoons? Students can interact with the cabinet through a series of competitions: naming as many objects as they can find, as well as nominating another item to include in the exhibit. There will also be a prize for the best piece of creative writing that includes objects from the display - we're really looking forward to reading the entries!

Athletic Development and The Fitness Suite News

During Games and after-school athletics and cricket training sessions, our student-athletes have been completing mini strength and conditioning blocks at the start of each session. In athletics they have been progressing through resisted sprinting and various speed drills, alongside different jumping, hopping, and bounding exercises. In cricket, we have lots of exercises that prepare for the demands of bowling, batting, and fielding. There is a specific focus on shoulder mobility and strength exercises which help reduce overuse injuries – this is especially important for fast bowlers. The bespoke strength and conditioning programmes have been designed to complement both sports, but also to enhance general athletic performance.

We are well into the DofE Assessor report season and we have had many students utilise the Fitness Suite as part of their physical section for all of the different levels over the last year. The Bronze Award tends to see individuals with general goals of improving strength and fitness. In contrast, the extensive Silver and Gold often see students training for more specific tailored goals or events such as half marathons and actual DofE expeditions. We are more than happy to continue to act as assessors for the physical sections in the future.

Finance Department's Mrs Cito's trip with GB Women's Ice Hockey

In my spare time away from work I am the performance analyst for the Women's Great Britain Ice Hockey team. I have been involved in the team since 2015 after I retired from being a player myself due to injury. The role has taken me all over the world to wonderful places such as Kazakhstan, South Korea, Finland, Slovenia and most recently Riga in Latvia. Riga hosted the IIHF Women's World Championships Division 1 Group B. This group included Latvia, Great Britain, Italy, Poland, Slovenia and Slovakia. Team GB were promoted to this group in 2022 and last year finished 5th in the group. The target for the tournament was to obtain 9 points (3 wins). The tournament started strong with a 1-0 win over Italy (who will be hosting the winter Olympics in 2 years' time) – a team we haven't beaten since 2008. We went on to play a very tight match against Poland who we took to overtime and then sadly lost 3-2. Our 3rd match was our toughest against the recently relegated Slovakia who are ranked 16th in the world. Due to a couple of penalties and bad luck, we lost 7-1, however we bounced back to convincingly beat Slovenia 2-1. These results took us to the Silver medal/4th place game against host nations Latvia. The match was a sell out with Latvian fans beating drums and chanting as loud as they could. GB went ahead after just 2 minutes 20 seconds, Latvia then tied the match and went onto score the next goal but GB persisted and scored to reach a tie again. 6 minutes to go in the match Latvia scored again to make it 3-2. GB threw everything into the remainder of the game, even pulling the goalie to gain a man advantage however it wasn't meant to be. We finished 4th in the tournament which is an improvement on the year prior but it was of course disappointing to get so close to medalling. The outcome has made us even hungrier to go again next year where we are determined to come home with silver wear. GB women's next tournament is the pre-Olympic qualifiers in November which is hopefully going to be hosted in the UK (potentially Nottingham) so stay posted for an update later in the year!

Even though the Athletics season has only just started with only two weekends of fixtures, two Nottingham High School students are already impressing on the track. Gabriel O (Year 9) has started the season where he left off last year. Gabriel was crowned the National 200m U13 champion in 2023. He has already improved his personal bests for the 100m, 200m and 300m. At a recent event in Loughborough, Gabriel ran amazing times to rank him second in the country for the 100m, 200m and 300m. All of the times Gabriel has posted so far are also English Schools qualifying times. Katie G (Year 12) is also in early season form, she has also ran an English Schools entry time for the 3000m and is in ranked in the top 15 in the country.

The schools athletes have over 20 fixtures this season and we look forward to following theirs and the schools success this season.
