PASTORAL NEWSLETTER

Dear Parents

Who can believe three weeks of the Spring Term have gone by already? As the evenings begin to draw out and the mornings become a little brighter, there is so much to look forward to. From the Junior Spring Concert to our Year 2s travelling back through time to experience life as Victorians. From outdoor education sessions to the House Cross Country at Wollaton Hall. From Book Week to EYFS taking a trip to White Post Farm. There really is something for everyone!

Hopefully, the brighter mornings will make it easier for us all to get out of bed in the mornings. January into February always seems the hardest time to resist the call of the snooze button as the wake-up alarm sounds. Clearly the children are not immune to this phenomenon. Since the start of term, we have seen an increase in the number of pupils arriving late into school. As a reminder, children in all IJS year groups can be dropped off any time from 8am onwards with the day formally starting at 8.30am when the registers are taken. Any pupils arriving after 8.40am have to be designated late in our registers.

Whilst we are keen to minimise the number of late marks recorded, our main priority is avoiding lost learning time. Days at the IJS are packed full with learning opportunities at all age levels and we get straight into these as soon as the registers are taken. Any pupils arriving after 8.30am not only compromise themselves, but often the learning and focus of their classmates too. For many pupils the emotional impact of being late can also unsettle them for the day ahead.

I urge all pupils to make sure they are in school ready for the start of the day at 8.30am every day. I know mornings can be a very stressful time trying to get a child (or children) up and out of bed, dressed in the correct uniform, fed, teeth brushed and out the door with everything required for the day. This is made all the worse if the child is not willing to play their part with expediting the process. If this is the case for your family and you would like the Form Tutor/Class Teacher to speak to your daughter/son about being empowered and making a positive difference to your morning routine, please do not hesitate to contact them. Often a word from a teacher has much more impact in these areas than that of a parent; I know this to my own detriment!


Due to fire regulations, a total of two tickets only are available per family.



Mrs Kawalec would like to offer the opportunity to the pupils in Year 1, who are having lessons on a musical instrument, to perform, during an assembly.






