MR CORDY'S NEWSLETTER

Dear Parents and Friends,

Who can believe we are already almost half way through the final term of the academic year? There is still a huge amount to look forward to this term but I know that at this stage, everyone will naturally begin to wonder about next academic year and what excitement it will bring. More information about transition activities will follow very soon.

From speaking to a number of parents of pupils in Year 5 and Year 6, I know what some of you are beginning to wonder about whether your child should be given their first mobile phone ahead of starting life in Year 7. As a parent of a Year 6 pupil myself, I know this is not an easy decision. I'm sure many of you can see the positives and the negatives for the pupils, and also the positives and the negatives for us, the parents.

With this being a decision I know parents will be keen to get right for their child, I thought it would be useful to clarify the school rules that relate to mobile phones. In the Infant and Junior School, pupils should not have any kind of mobile device unless they travel home on one of the school buses or on public transport with an older sibling/relative. These pupils must ensure the school are aware that they do carry such a device and that it is switched off during the day.

In the Senior School, having a mobile or smartphone is not a requirement for life in Year 7 or indeed any other year group. No matter what your child tells you, they do not 'have to have one'. For those pupils who are permitted to have a phone by their parents, there are clear expectations in relation to their use at school. Mobile/smartphones may be used for sensible calls, texts and apps during breaks, but they must not be used antisocially. Photo and video functions may only be used in school or in the school context with a teacher's specific permission, and any internet use must comply with the School's IT Acceptable Use Policy, which is available to view on the school website <u>here</u>.

It is a requirement for Senior School pupils to have a device such as a tablet or laptop to assist with their learning. This device cannot be a mobile/smartphone. As your child prepares for life in Year 7, our IT Department will be in touch with more information about Digital Learning and BYOD. In the meantime, if you are interested in our BYOD Policy, it is available on the School's website <u>here</u>.






